- Bob Powell, Ann Robinson, Sharon Kirby, Dave Todd, Bill Reitz, Nancy Easterly, 1 mentee
- Providing PD for 7 consecutive years
- Original grant requested 25. In 2015 provided 80 contact hours for 94 participants (elementary and middle)
- Impacted over 400 participants in 7 yrs, which translates to between 3,000 and 4,000 students
- Presented at MSP conference in 2013, only MSP project accepted to present on "Programs that Produce Results"




UNIV. WISC. RIVER FALLS EARL BLODGETT, LOWELL MCCANN

- Earl Blodgett, Lowell McCann, Elaine Gwinn,1 mentee
- Participants could pay to receive graduate credit (\$1500) or workshop credit (\$950) for the two weeks. Had 3 attend last year and 13 this year (the 3 from last year came back). The Oversight Committee approved funds to give each teacher \$200 to help offset the costs and the result was 13 registered and attended.
- All 13 attendees indicated they would do another topic next year so the dates for 2016 have been set for June 20-31.
- That is a 100% retention rate!!








IDAHO STATE UNIVERSITY STEVE SHROPSHIRE

- 31 participants in 2015, K-6 teachers, 24 of the 31 were returning from prior years.
- Has been NSF or MSP funded since 2004 and had over 485 participants with an average of 40/year
- First project in Idaho to document significant impact on students of teachers attending the institutes when compared to nonattendees (Idaho state exam)



NWOSU STEVE MAIER

- Steve Maier, Christine Audo (mentee),
 Evelyn Restivo
- Had 25 in 2015 for grades 3-12 for 40 hrs.
 Half had attended prior workshops.
- Was 5th year for a total of 80 "unique" teachers (137 total)
- Note: Need VERY experienced PTRAs to be able to handle a group with a wide range of grade levels or need two PTRAs and split the group (more expense)

- 75 participants; 40 contact hours

- Fall 2014, Perimeter Institute overview 6 hr workshop @ Millersville University of PA; 10 participants sponsored by Central PA Section; fee for service (\$75) by Callahan & McCachren
- Spring 2015, TIPERS @ Messiah College; 12 participants; sponsored by Central PA Section; fee for service (\$75) by Callahan & McCachren
- Southeastern PA section, Jay Bagley 82 (no fee charged)





TEXAS

 TSAAPT--3 workshops, Invited talk on "How You Can Benefit from PTRA"; 15 contact hours for 100 teachers and professors.

 Dallas ISD--14 middle school teachers preparing for the HS physics certification exam; 80+ contact hours

LESSONS LEARNED

- Need for experienced PTRAs when the range of teacher participants is wide such ask grades 3-12.
- Need sites to train mentees
- Need "safety net" support for sites to launch a PTRA workshop
- Need multiple PTRAs for large or lengthy workshops (share load)
- Need to make mentee expectations more clear

SUMMARY

- Over 1200 Teachers impacted in 2014-2015
- Idaho was first project in Idaho to document significant impact on students of teachers attending the institutes when compared to nonattendees (Idaho state exam)
- Bob Powell presented at MSP conference in 2013, only MSP project accepted to present on "Programs that Produce Results"
- 30 year anniversary of providing quality professional development to teachers across the country
